And on it goes, ministry that is.

Now you may find some folks who are tired and who need to take a break. Some people may leave and others will come. This is a time in between times. This is a sacred time of renewal. May your days to come glorify God and may the next pastor love you as you so richly deserve. I will pray for your bright future and always count you as an important part of my family. Remember that you are always welcome in our home in Seattle, Washington.


